I think this marina plan would be detrimental to that goal.

This marina would cause a large amount of pollution entering a harbor that does not quickly flush. Besides being horrible for the marine ecosystem, I am concerned about the noise and air pollution. I can hear, see, and smell the harbor from my house. I do not look forward to diesel fumes wafting into my house as I eat breakfast. The proposed area for this marina faces open water and is much better suited to being an anchorage than a marina. Insurance companies will not cover hurricane damage. All boats moored in the marina will be forced to leave in the face of an oncoming hurricane. Where will they go? There is currently a waiting list for spaces in Hurricane Hole.

I believe the SEG proposal would greatly effect the local economy. The type of environment they would like to create is exactly the type of environment tourists come here to escape. Coral Bay is special because it is different than other places. We have local artists and craftsmen who make and sell things. We do not need to bring in high end designer outlets, we make things right here in Coral Bay. I know the French and Italians are having a tough time, but I think we should concentrate our economic efforts a little closer to home. These kind of stores are better suited for cruise ship destinations. I really hope that is not what is being planned for Coral Bay.
